View Must-See Scenery

A bamboo forest path with a 1.8km long bamboo fence created by bamboo artisans from over 8 different types of bamboo. It is beloved by visitors as a "walking path of healing" thanks to the sound of the breeze, the songs of the birds, the sunbeams that filter through the trees, and the scents that only a forest can provide.

A Scenic Area That's Beautiful in All Four Seasons
Nagaokatenmangu Shrine Hachijogaikae Pond (MAP ⑤)

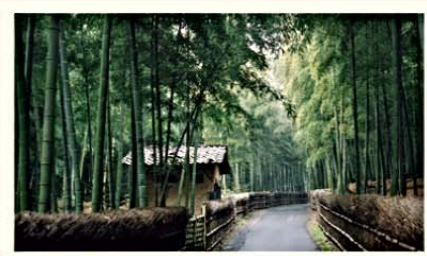
A spot located on the east side of Nagakata Tenmangu where you can really feel each season's unique mood. In late April a 150-year-old nodotodokoro blooms with deep-red flowers. Visitors can also enjoy cherry blossoms, lotus flowers, irises, autumn leaves, and more.

A Famous Autumn Leaf Spot Dyed With Vivid Colors
Komoyo-ji Temple (MAP ④)

During late autumn, the Japanese maple trees on both sides of the path to the temple come alive with vivid color. The brilliant red and orange autumn leaves that fill your vision to make a tunnel, together with the maple leaves that bury the stone monuments, paint a picture that is beautiful whether you're facing up or down.

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A Tunnel Where You Can Feel the Seasons
The Path to Muko Shrine (MAP ②)

The straight path to this shrine is beautifully adorned with cherry blossoms in the spring and autumn leaves in the fall.

Seasonal Scenery
Asahi Beer Oyamazaki Villa Museum of Art The View From the Terrace (MAP ③)

In the spring, Sewaritei cherry blossoms can be seen dividing the Kizu River and Uji River. In the fall, visitors can see autumn leaves.

A Vivid Cherry Blossom Tunnel
Yodogawa Riverside Park Sewaritei Area (MAP ②)

Approximately 250 Someiyoshino cherry trees have been planted approximately 1.4 km along the embankment, and visitors can pass through a long, vivid pink cherry blossom tunnel during the period of late March and early April.

A Temple That Changes As Autumn Deepens
Zenpouritsu-ji Temple (MAP ⑤)

The famous general Yoshimitsu Ashikaga's mother had donated Japanese maple trees to the temple before 600 years ago. In late November visitors can see various colors of autumn foliage.

Takenoko Macarons

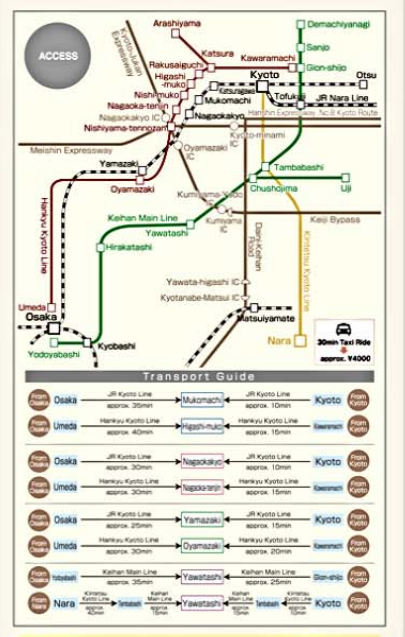

History
History Filled With Romance

A Space of Healing
Asahi Beer Oyamazaki Villa Museum of Art (MAP ③)

The main building was built at the start of Japan's Showa period (which began in 1926) and is registered as a national tangible cultural asset. It contains works from the Mirai, or Japanese folk art, movement, and the building designed by the architect Tadao Ando. "Chichu no Hosenkibako" (the underground jewelry box) display's Monet's "Water Lilies". We hope you'll enjoy walking around the garden during each season and enjoy cherry blossoms, green leaves, and autumn leaves throughout the year.

The Greatest Statue of King Enma Hoshaku-ji Temple (MAP ①)

Built in the year 724, during Japan's Momoyama period. Its three-storied pagoda, or Sanjū no To, has been designated an intangible cultural asset. The best part is undoubtedly the statues of King Enma and Kenzoku. We hope you'll take a look at them. Be sure to make a wish to King Enma so you don't fall into the underworld.

A Land Beloved by the God of Learning
Nagaokatenmangu Shrine (MAP ⑤)

Dedicated to the God of Learning, Michizane Sugawara. Sugawara enjoyed poetry, song, and orchestral music, and is said to have regretted their loss when he was promoted to regional government.



A Rare Shrine Where the Stars and Stripes Are Flown Twice a Year
Iwashimizu-Hachimangō Shrine (MAP ⑤)

This shrine was built in the year 860. The main building had been designated as a nationally important cultural property. It is also said that Thomas Alva Edison had used "Yawatashi bamboo" as a filament of a bulb, and there is Edison Monument inside the precincts.

An Old Shrine Built in AD 718
Muko Shrine (MAP ②)

This shrine was built with an architectural style known as "Sangen Yashiro Nagare-Zukuri", which has been designated as a Japanese intangible cultural asset.

A Relaxing Japanese Garden
Shokado Garden (MAP ⑤)

This garden has been designated as one of the most beautiful spots in Japan. There was a famous calligrapher who was to live about 400 years ago, call Shōjo Shokado. He built Shokado teahouse in the last stage of his life. Today, it is in the middle of the garden. Visitors can enjoy approximately 200 types of camellias and appreciate approximately 40 types of bamboo.

The Ancient Capital
Nagaokakyo Daigokuden Shoanden Ruins/ Chodoin Ruins (MAP ③)

The central part of Nagakakyo, which was home to the capital for a scant 10 years from AD 784 to 794. Daigokuden was an important place where the emperor ruled conducted politics, and Chodoin was a place where national affairs and rituals were conducted. 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A Temple With the Name "Feet of the Gods"
Kotari Shrine (MAP ⑥)

Founded by Emperor Karum, who said he had a dream where a god descended from the heavens to protect the Imperial Court from an attack by evil spirits. In recent years the meaning of its name has inspired marathon runners, famous sports stars, and many other people with leg-related wishes to come and pray for luck.

Learn How Delicious Beer is Made
Suntory Kyoto Brewery (MAP ⑦)

Enjoy touring the beer manufacturing process and enjoy free samples of freshly made beer.

Japan's First Whisky Distillery
Suntory Yamazaki Distillery (MAP ①)

Construction began in 1923 when the founder of Suntory, Shinjiro Torii, decided to build Japan's first malt whisky brewery. Starting with "Single Malt Whisky Yamazaki", Suntory Whisky steadily grew to be beloved by many dedicated whisky fans.

The Only Shrine Dedicated to Safe Flight Prayers in Japan
Hikoujinjya Shrine (MAP ③)

This shrine was built by Chuhaichi Ninomiya who was a pioneer of aviation. He built this shrine in hope of aviation security and development of the industry. He discovered the aviation principle before the Wright Brothers. Approximately 800 airplane models are displayed in the archives within the shrine precincts.
